Sunday, October 13 at 5:00 PM - The historic Yarmouth New Church will host the final concert of the six-part series "Americana, a New Voice for a New Nation" that traces the arc of American popular music. The October 13 concert will present a range of songs that reflect the American spirit in a time of great adversity from themes of shared suffering to shared optimism; the songs are unique to the 1930s. Popular tunes representing The Great Depression, The Dustbowl Blues, and the successful union of Broadway and Hollywood musicals will be performed by seven vocalists in the restored interior of the Yarmouth New Church. Tickets will be available at the door for \$20. Vocalists will include Ron Williams, Joan Kirchner, Celeste Howe, Linda Delorey, Jo Brisbane, Art Brisbane, and Ellen Adamson, accompanied by pianist Lucy Banner.

Join the CCCO in a program featuring the life and story of "Black Sam" Bellamy, who, after becoming one of the richest pirates in history, goes down with his crew in 1717 aboard the *Whydah* during a violent storm off the coast of Wellfleet. Composer Sam Wu premieres a new work, "Sam Bellamy, A Portrait" depicting this harrowing story as we present a collaborative concert with the *Whydah* Pirated Museum.
